There were about 300 - 400 people throughout the evening. This year in conjunction with Multicultural Club and AP Human Geography Class we wanted to have a cultural fair to open our celebration to all the cultures at FHS.

Our Objectives & District Goals:

One of our district goals is equity as defined as "we work to ensure access to opportunities and resources for all individuals." We want to open up the opportunities for all students to celebrate and learn about the cultures and ethnicities that make up our school. We want to create a welcoming and equitable community. Research in equity and diversity shows that exposure to other people is one of the ways barriers are broken down between people. This event will facilitate exposure to other cultures and give students opportunities to learn and celebrate through food, dance, and games.

Potential/Effect/Audience:

We hope this becomes an annual community event. As our Franklin community becomes more diverse we desperately need opportunities to learn and grow as a compassionate and untied community. We hope to provide an opportunity with this fun and celebratory event. We'd like it to grow into something that people look forward to each year or every other year.

Success:

Our success will be measured by the number of people attending and the anecdotal information gathered from students involved in hosting and a survey of participants and attendees. We hope to get ideas for what went well, needed improvements, frequency of the event, and future needs from the survey

FHS Culture Fest:

The event is open to the entire community (see the attached flyer). It will include:

- Table exhibits from about 20 different cultures run by students (teacher and parent volunteers)
- Activities for all include:
 - Button making
 - o Tee shirt making
 - Henna booth
 - o Kindness Pledge Wall
 - Turban Tying
 - Photo Booth
 - o Where is this country? Game
 - Hijab Wrapping (education on Hijab in many religions and cultures)
- Kid's Zone activities for young kids, coloring, craft, storytelling, etc.
- Franklin Public Library will have a booth highlighting books about different cultures.
- Performances include:
 - Dabke Dance
 - o Indian Dance
 - Bosnian Storyteller
 - Native American Drum Circle
 - o Serbian Dance
 - o Irish Dance
- Fashion Show with Traditional/Cultural dress
- Optional Short talks on religion and how it relates to culture/ethnicity we find that
 many students have little understanding (which leads to misinformation) about world
 religions.
- Kids will have a passport that they can have stamped at the many tables.
- Students and adults have a game that helps them mingle and meet new people
- Food from many cultures, some at the tables and we are working on having a few restaurants come and serve food.
